Landowners were empowered to understand and reduce their wildfire risk.

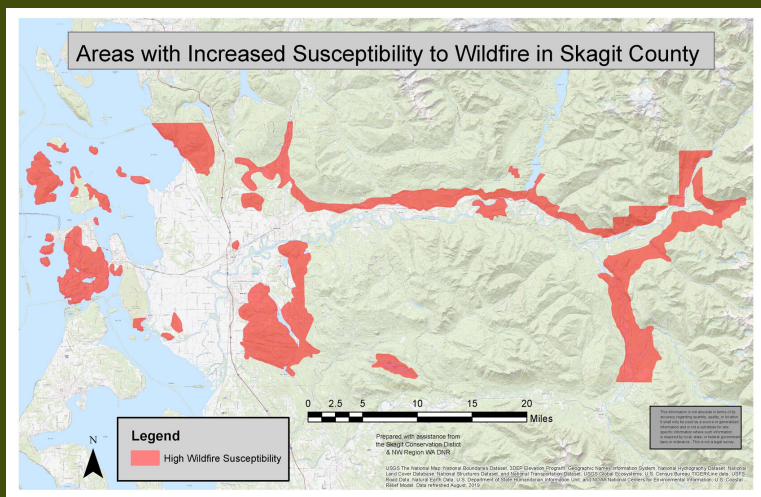


Partnerships
